

SAINT THOMAS' EPISCOPAL SCHOOL DISTINCTIVES

- STE engages students in a classical-style education, which emphasizes the study of Latin, philosophy and the classics.
- Students must complete required reading each summer. Past literature has included Quo Vadis, Dr. Jekyll & Mr. Hyde, The Count of Monte Cristo, All Quiet on the Western Front, The Picture of Dorian Grey, and Twelve Years a Slave.
- The Scottish Arts program, created by the school's founder because of the tradition, discipline, and prestige of the pipe bands of the British Army, has been at the core of STE's identity since the late 1950s. Students participating in the Pipe Band receive instruction on the Great Highland bagpipe or Scottish snare, tenor, or bass drum. As part of the curriculum for Lower School and an elective for Middle and Upper School, Highland Dance promotes physical grace and precise muscle control.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM OVERVIEW

STE offers students a rigorous, college preparatory liberal arts curriculum that emphasizes mathematics, sciences and languages in addition to traditional liberal arts disciplines such as English, history, religion and philosophy. Courses are taught in a rotating, seven-period schedule that includes daily chapel. Grades are posted at the end of each semester.

- GPAs are computed on a weighted 4.0 scale. Students earn an additional 1.0 for each AP class.
- Non-academic electives (i.e. band, highland dance) are not computed in the GPA.
- GPAs are computed at the end of each semester.

COVID-19 STATEMENT

- STE completed Q4 of the 2019-20 year in an online format due to COVID-19. To ensure student grades were not adversely affected by the shift to online learning, final exams (normally 20% of the semester grade) were canceled, and the second semester grade was calculated using Q3 and Q4 grades with the the higher of the two representing 60% of the semester grade and the lower of the two 40%.
- STE began 2020-21 online. After three weeks, students could choose whether to return to campus or continue with online learning. Because some students remained online all year, STE opted not to administer semester exams in either semester.
- Due to COVID-19 safety protocols, clubs and organizations operated in a somewhat limited capacity. Varsity athletics, however, did compete.
